2. C. Full grown moose antlers can weigh up to 40 kg. By January, the antlers have fallen off and the bulls look quite a bit like female moose, called cows.
3. B. False. Moose are found in North America as well as on the continents of Asia and Europe.
4. D. Moose are herbivores (animals that eat mostly plants) and they browse twigs. They do not graze on grass, but snip twigs and other vegetation.
5. A. There is only one species of moose.
6. C. Moose calves gain 300-400 kg in their first year of life. When they are born they weigh about as much as a large sack of flour.
7. B. The moose gestation period is 8 months, almost as long as human pregnancies.
8. B. Bull Moose douse themselves with urine during courtship to attract cows. A Moose's urine has pheromones that actually appeal to female Moose noses.
9. D. Moose mostly hang out in the Boreal Forest.
10. B. Moose have a heart-shaped hoof print. Moose also have long legs and can step easily through deep snow.
