

# Bison

## Across

- An area of bare ground where bison roll around in the dust.
- The Family of hoofed animals that includes cattle, sheep, and goats.
- The reproductive strategy where one gender mates with several members of the other gender over the course of a season.
- Two clouts with curved outer walls.
- This subspecies of bison has rounded shoulders, afro-like hair, shorter horns and chaps on it's forelegs.
- The long digestion of animals with a four-chambered stomach.
- Non-woody plants that die back after every growing season.
- The disappearance of an animal from a specific region or country.  
A forest-growing forb that sprouts berries.

## Down

- This subspecies of bison has square shoulders, straight hair, an indistinct cape, longer horns, and no chaps on it's forelegs.
- A toe that makes up a single hoof.
- The latin name of the American Bison. (2 words)
- A young ungulate.
- A hard, bony, permanent outgrowth found on the heads of bison and some other hoofed mammals.
- Lip curl performed by certain ungulates to enhance their ability to smell hormones.
- The area on the Bison's back with longer hair.
- A large, usually treeless and flat, area of grassland.
- Courtship behaviour in ungulates where males act aggressively against one another.
- The conversion of sugar to carbon dioxide and alcohol.
- A belch.
- A coarse, grass-like plant, usually found in wet areas.
