- The treeless region of the arctic or mountains.
- Coarse, grass-like plants, usually found in wet areas.
- The seasonal mass movement of animals from one place to another.
- To propel the body through water using arms and/or legs.
- Both male and female Caribou have these temporary bond growths.
- One of the Caribou's predators, it's latin name is *Canis lupus*.
- This insulates the Caribou from the cold and makes it easier for them to float when swimming. (2 words)
- Animals with hooves.
- One of the Caribou's predators, it's latin name is *Ursus arctos*. (2 words)
- The shrubby transition zone between the northern forest and the tundra.

Down

- Tracks left by an animal moving over a surface.
- Another name for Caribou, Rudolph is one of these.
- Caribou eat this in the summer, your lawn is full of it.
- Any warm-blooded animal of the vertebrate class Mammalia, the females have mammary glands.
- Tough fibrous tissue that connects a muscle to bone.
- Plant-like organisms that are part fungus and part algae.
- Land-dwelling.
- Mould, yeast, mushrooms and toadstools.
- This type of Caribou is endangered.
